

Fluid Volume

The British Imperial fluid ounce and the American fluid ounce are not exactly the same so this section is comprised of two parts: a *British Imperial Fluid Volume* chart and a *US Fluid Volume* chart, so be sure to refer to the right country's chart (although the slight difference isn't really noticeable until you get up into gallons). To convert larger volumes, see the *Fluid Volume Conversion Formulas* on page 199.

The metric system is now the primary system for most volume measures used in Britain, with a few exceptions such as returnable milk bottles.
